We know you want answers to questions specifically about our summer program and we want to provide you with what we know today.

Will there be a summer program at the LAC this summer?

- Yes!!! **Liberty Athletic Center** will begin on Monday, July 6, 2020 and will run for 7 weeks.

Are you working on summer plans?

- Of course we are!!! Our director has been hard at work creating great summer plans. The following is just a few of the things they will be taking into consideration this summer:
 - The need for social distancing, smaller groups (10 children to 2 counselors), and attention to daily transitions.
 - Each group having a self-contained “home base.”
 - Each group having set times for indoor and outdoor activities.

What will my child's typical day look like?

- In their small group, their day will be filled with planned indoor group activities, park visits, games, arts & crafts and more.

Will there be field trips?

- At this time, we are suspending all trips. This will only serve to motivate the camp staff to make each day very special while the children are at camp.

Will the campers go outside or get to play in the gym?

- Yes, following all the guidelines put forth by the CDC and the State of New Jersey Office of Licensing.

Will there be daily swim?

- At this time, the official guidelines do not allow us to offer daily swim.

Will there be Theme Days and Special Programs?

- Yes, they will be theme days and special programs added to the schedule.

Do I provide lunch for my child every day?

- Yes, disposable lunch, snacks and beverages must be brought from home every day. No meals can be provided by the LAC. Treat every day as a field trip! Everything will be thrown out. Lunch will be in the child's home base.

Will cleaning procedures be any different this summer?

- Sanitizing procedures will follow CDC guidelines. We will bring in additional housekeeping staff for the summer to accomplish this. We will have plenty of soap, water and hand sanitizer and will use it often.
